Fourth Sunday of Easter: 20th/21st April, 2024 (Year B)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Have any of you ever tried to move a mob of sheep from one paddock to another? I have. My uncle was a farmer, and once, many years ago while staying with my aunt and uncle, my uncle asked some of my cousins and me to help him move a mob of sheep out of one paddock, down the road a bit, around the corner of a T junction in the road, and then into another paddock. Well, for this little city kid it was quite an adventure. This little city kid was wrong. It all sounds simple doesn't it? Move some sheep from one paddock to the next, just up the road a bit. Well, these sheep did not want to go through the gate. And when they finally did go through the gate, they went everywhere – jumping through channels at the side of road, and bolting for freedom this way and that.

We got them together again, and then started to move them down the road. As we came to the corner at the T-junction, my uncle told me to run ahead and stop them from taking the wrong turn into the T-junction. At this point, this little city kid was beginning to wish that his uncle was not a farmer. I was standing there, madly waving my arms about, trying to stop a couple of hundred sheep from going straight ahead, trying to get them to turn a corner. Almost all of them went the right way, and we finally got them into the second paddock.

Sheep are hard work.

And that is why what Jesus says in today's Gospel is so astounding.

For the people of Israel sheep were important animals. They not only provided meat. They also provided wool, milk, oil and skins. Because sheep were so necessary to the life of Ancient Israel, shepherds were important people. The life of the community depended – in part – on them. If a shepherd was slack and did not look after his sheep; if the shepherd let the sheep run away; if the shepherd let the sheep be attacked, the people ultimately suffered.

Sheep are hard work, and the people who first heard these words of Jesus knew this, just as they knew the value of a good shepherd, and the dangers of a poor shepherd. But Jesus does not only extol the virtues of any good shepherd. He goes one step further.

Jesus proclaims himself to be the Good Shepherd: the One who knows his sheep, and the One who will lay down his life for his sheep. In the light of this Easter Candle, these words ring with an even deeper truth for us. Jesus is the One who has laid down his life for us, his sheep. Jesus is the same one who was risen on the third day to destroy death forever. But it is not enough that Jesus is the Good Shepherd.

In Baptism, we are baptised into the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. Because of this Baptism, we are called to be Christ in the world today. And that baptismal vocation is strengthened in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Through our washing in the waters of new life in the Sacrament of Baptism, and our anointing with Sacred Chrism in the Sacrament of Confirmation, we are called to be the good shepherds for our world today.

For this reason, the Church asks us, on this Good Shepherd Sunday during the Easter Season, to remember the vocation which arises from Baptism and Confirmation. All of us are called and indeed challenged to be Christ in the world.

Good Shepherd Sunday is also a day when the Church asks us to pray especially for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. So, on this Good Shepherd Sunday, in a special way, we turn to God in prayer. And our prayer is that God will continue to provide priests for his Church, shepherds after his own heart. Priests who will faithfully proclaim the Word of God; priests who will minister the Sacraments and equip the People of God for ministry. And we pray, too, that God may give us warm and generous hearts with which to always support and encourage our priests.

With the desire to enter the Priesthood still present, he returned to the seminary and completed a Masters of Theology. In January 2014 Marty was ordained Deacon, serving on the Sunshine Coast, and was ordained as a priest on the 27th of June 2014.

Along with his service in many parishes, Fr Marty was also an Associate Director for Vocations.

Fr Marty's funeral took place on the 19th of May at St Stephen's Cathedral.

He is remembers as a warm and likable priest, who had a wonderful sense of fun, and spirituality.
