The Ascension of the Lord: 11th/12th May, 2024 (Year B)

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

There is a Pentecost feel to the Ascension Gospel from Mark, a sense that is matched in the passages from Ephesians and the opening text from Acts. However, Mark is not quite done with his approach to the designated Apostles! Our reading starts perhaps a verse late. In the prior sentence the risen Jesus admonishes the remaining Eleven for their hesitancy to believe that he was risen. His reproach to the leadership signals a reinvigorated fervour and passion in them for the mission of the Church. There is nothing half-hearted about Jesus' command: the followers are to go to the whole earth, and to all of creation. The good news is for every place and every aspect of creation.

The dynamic of the Ascension is the same. Jesus does not simply return to the heavens but takes his place beside God. He fills heaven and is at one with the divinity. At the same time, the Eleven go on mission, preaching everywhere. Their work is supported by Christ, who is working with them.

The same dynamic is in the Pauline lections. In the Ephesians 1 passage, we have a more full description of Jesus at the right hand of God. Christ is above all principalities and powers, now and forthwith. In this he remains present to his body, the Church, enabling it to be the fullness of his presence. The ascension is a way to speak of how the risen Jesus is revealed as touching all things, filling them, holding them, keeping them.

As the reading continues the emphasis falls to the Church, his body. We see this in the Ephesians 4 option, where we are reminded of the call to unity: one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and below one differentiated ministry.

The earliest liturgical wisdom was that the feast of the Ascension was celebrated on the morning of the Sunday that followed the final week of Easter, and that Pentecost was celebrated that same evening. Our set of readings show how interconnected the two feasts are, both opening up our eyes to the presence of Christ and the Spirit in all creation and all history. With that is the insistence of the Church as the presence of Christ on earth, held in the power of the Spirit. This ongoing presence to all creation through the Church presages the eschatological fulfilment of all things in Christ's second coming.

In a way this feast about the risen Christ, is one about the nature of the church. Following Paul, it is the body of Christ on earth. Following Acts, it is infused by the Spirit, a gift which enables the disciples to comprehend the reign of God. Following our Gospel, and its more salutary prior verse, the ascension is a source of energy and mission, of vitality and signs.

If this is the case, then what does it mean to go to the ends of the earth, to reach to all of creation? And what does it mean to acknowledge that the Lord worked through them and with them? There is a breadth in this mission, and a confidence in Christ, that reshapes our approaches, and goes beyond our boundaries.
