Third Sunday of Easter (3rd/4th May, 2025)

Brothers and sisters,

We need to open our eyes, ears and hearts wide to see, hear, and experience the Risen Lord coming into our lives in various forms, circumstances, and events.

Today's Gospel narrative shows us the rehabilitation of Peter, who denied Jesus three times in the courtyard of Caiaphas, repented, and then received Primacy in the Church from Jesus. The Gospel also shows us God in search of us, even when we try to evade Him.

The first reading (Acts 5:27-32, 40-41), tells us how the Holy Spirit transformed Peter, whom Jesus had appointed head of His Church, from a man fearful of powerful men into a brave witness to the Resurrection. Peter stands before the Jewish Supreme Court – the Sanhedrin – boldly announcing that he and the others must obey God rather than men.

The second reading (Revelations 5:11-14), presents John's vision of the Risen Lord as the glorified "Lamb of God," enthroned in Heaven. The whole of Revelation is an expression of Christian hope in the Risen Lord.

Today's Gospel (John 21:1-19) tells the post-Resurrection story of our merciful Saviour who goes in search of His band of disappointed and dejected disciples. The incident proves that Jesus' appearances were not mere hallucinations. In the first part of today's Gospel, the Risen Jesus appears to His disciples and gives them a symbol of their mission in a miraculous catch of fish followed by a grilled fish breakfast prepared by Jesus himself. The second part is a dialogue between Jesus and Simon where Simon is asked three times whether he loves Jesus, and he answers that he does, as if in reparation for his triple denial of Jesus. The two metaphors used in the story, namely fishing and shepherding, are the duties of the Church in her missionary work. Peter, as a forgiven sinner, is chosen for the quality of his love to serve as leader in a community of brothers and sisters. As his primary mission, Peter is given the care of the vulnerable lambs and sheep, and he is told that fidelity to this mission will lead him to martyrdom.

We need to open our eyes, ears and hearts wide to see, hear, and experience the Risen Lord coming into our lives in various forms, circumstances, and events: The Risen Lord blesses us with success and achievements. We often fail to acknowledge the presence of the Risen Lord behind our unexpected successes, great achievements, promotions at work, miraculous healings, and success in relationships. He is right there in our parties, celebrations, and occasions of rejoicing. The Risen Lord is present in our pains and suffering. Acts 9:1-13 tells us how the Risen Lord transformed the life of Saul by pushing him down onto the Damascus Road and making him temporarily blind. The same Jesus often visits us in the form of accidents, illnesses, pain, suffering, and problems in relationships. The Risen Lord visits us through our friends and well-wishers. He is present in those who visit us and encourages us in our sad and desperate moments. The Risen Lord visits us in the form of unexpected help from the least expected persons in our dire needs.

God is Good, All the Time!

Bible Reflection—4th May 2025 (Third Sunday of Easter) 'When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore, but the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish.' - John 21:4-6

Reflect, today, upon the symbolism found in this Resurrection account. Consider the fact that the Gospel has, indeed, been shared with you. Have you listened to the Word of God as it is preached by the Church?

Do you immerse yourself in the grace given through the Sacraments? Do you follow the Ten Commandments faithfully? Do you continually open yourself to the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit? Seek to be among that catch of fish caught on the "right side."

Never doubt that hell is real and possible. For that reason, never waver from your fidelity to Christ, so that you will remain firmly grounded in His grace and share one day in His Resurrection.

The Rites of the Conclave

The rites of the conclave begin with the public Mass which is set to be celebrated on May 7 at 10am local time in St Peter's Basilica. The cardinals to gather in the late afternoon in the Pauline Chapel and then process into the Sistine Chapel.

The cardinals will take an oath to "faithfully and scrupulously observe" the rules for electing a pope. They also promise to keep everything having to do with the election secret.

When the last cardinal has placed his hand on the Book of the Gospels and sworn the oath, Archbishop Diego Ravelli, Vatican master of liturgical ceremonies, will say: "Extra omnes," ordering all those not directly involved in the conclave out of the Sistine Chapel.

The cardinals decide together whether they will cast one ballot on the first evening.

After that, two ballots can be cast each morning and two each afternoon until a candidate garners two-thirds of the votes. On the fourth day, if no one has been elected, the cardinals pause for extended prayer.

When someone reaches the two-thirds threshold – 89 votes if, as reported, 133 cardinals enter the conclave – he will be asked by the most senior ranking cardinal, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, "Do you accept your canonical election as supreme pontiff?"

The ballots, along with the cardinals' notes or running tallies of the votes, are burned with a chemical additive to produce white smoke and announce to the world that there has been a successful election.

Then the senior cardinal deacon, French Cardinal Dominique Mamberti, will go to the central balcony of St Peter's Basilica and declare to the public, "Habemus papam" ("We have a pope").

Jubilee of Entrepreneurs 4th-5th May

From Pope Francis' Message to French entrepreneurs (2023):

"Entrepreneurs suffer when their business suffers, and they suffer a great deal when the business goes bankrupt and has to close. There is little in the media about the difficulties and pain of entrepreneurs who close their businesses and fail through no fault of their own.

The book of Job teaches us that misfortune is not synonymous with fault, because it also strikes the righteous, and that success is not immediately synonymous with virtue and goodness. Misfortune affects everyone, the good and the bad alike. The Church understands the suffering of the good entrepreneur, she understands your suffering. She welcomes it, she accompanies you, she thanks you. From the very beginning, the Church has also welcomed merchants, the precursors of modern entrepreneurs. In the Bible and the Gospels, there is often talk of money and trade, and some of the most beautiful stories in the history of salvation are also about economics: drachmas, talents, landowners, administrators, precious pearls. In the Gospel of Luke, the father of the prodigal son is presented to us as a rich man, perhaps a landowner. In the same way, the Good Samaritan could have been a merchant; he stopped by the wounded man, took care of him and then entrusted him to an innkeeper, paying him with two denarii.

"The good entrepreneur, like the "good shepherd" of the Gospel, unlike the

"hireling", knows his workers because he knows their work. One of the serious crises of our time is the entrepreneur's loss of contact with the work of his company, and therefore with his workers, who become "invisible" (Pierre Y. Gomes). You became entrepreneurs because one day you were fascinated by the smell of the workshop, by the joy of touching your products with your hands, by the satisfaction of seeing that your services are useful: never forget that this is how your vocation was born. And in this you are like Joseph, like Jesus who spent part of his life working as a craftsman: "the Word became a carpenter". He knew the aroma of wood."

Lord God,

we pray for those who are entrepreneurs in our world.

May their eyes be open to see the needs of their clients, employees, and all they encounter in their entrepreneurial journey.

May they strive to achieve a fair distribution of the world's resources, to protect the human family, and to take care of our common home.

May their hearts be filled with the desire to serve more than to be served, to give more than to receive, and to love unconditionally as You love us. We make this prayer through Christ our Lord.
